<p>Formal observations/screening report</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 1 hour observation in school or at home - 1 hour consultation with teachers with verbal feedback and advice - 1 hour consultation with parents with verbal feedback and advice - Summary report is emailed to both school and parents 	<p>The main purpose of this is to determine whether a child needs further assessment and is especially helpful for parents/teachers who are not quite sure if a full psychological assessment is needed.</p>	<p>9,000 THB*</p> <p>*If a full assessment is recommended, the cost of the formal observation will be deducted.</p>
<p>Exam Access Assessment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Individual work with the child or young person (2 hours) in their home or school - A summary report will be emailed to parents and teachers 	<p>An Exam Access Assessment Report includes individual work with the child or young person, completing a wide range of assessments completed in one visit. These are then scored and presented in a report which is emailed to parents and teachers. The main purpose of this is to gather data to present to examination boards for exam access arrangements.</p>	<p>12,000 THB</p>
<p>Psycho-Developmental Assessment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 1 hour observation in school or at home - 1 hour consultation with teachers - 1 hour consultation with parents - 3-4 hour assessment with the child or young person completed over 2 sessions (where necessary) - Summary report is emailed to both school and parents alongside follow up meetings - A further following up meeting can be scheduled 4-6 weeks after the assessment 	<p>This assessment evaluates a child's development and explores the social, emotional, communication, adaptive functioning, and behavioral development from a psychological perspective. When necessary, this assessment is conducted in collaboration with professionals from other disciplines, including speech and occupational therapists.</p>	<p>25,000 THB</p>



<p>Psycho-Educational Assessment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 1 hour observation in school or at home - 1 hour consultation with teachers - 1 hour consultation with parents - 3-4 hour assessment with the child or young person completed over 2 sessions (where necessary) - Summary report is emailed to both school and parents alongside follow up meetings - A further following up meeting can be scheduled 4-6 weeks after the assessment 	<p>This assessment is used to provide an understanding of learning (including intellectual ability). The assessment is performed using standardised assessment tools. This type of evaluation is often conducted when concerns arise regarding an individual's learning. It provides evaluation of an individual's cognitive abilities, academic skills and/or behaviours to determine their areas of strengths and areas for development. Such assessments can serve to ascertain if an individual has a learning difficulty, is gifted, or to identify areas that require special attention. Findings from a psycho-educational assessment can help to identify suitable avenues of support.</p>	<p>25,000 THB</p>
<p>Feedback</p>	<p>Each type of assessment includes feedback to both the family and the school as well as a follow up meeting after 4-6 weeks.</p>	<p>Free</p>
